

## photocall



In order to make the campaign visible, we can use the entrance hall of the school, parish center, sociocultural center, etc. It can even be transformed into a Photocall where classes, groups, etc. can take pictures.

## **Activity:**

Hang a map of each continent in the hall-ways and corridors. Attached you will find the maps for download.

On each continent, mark the Itaka-Escolapios offices and hang some pictures of each office. The pictures will be attached.

- Bolivia: Angaldo, Cocapata, Cochabamba, Santa Cruz;
- Brazil: Aracaju, Belo Horizonte, Governador Valadares, Serra;
- Burkina Faso: Zingane;
- Cameroon: Bafia, Bamenda, Bamendjou, Bandjoun, Kumbo, Yaunde;
- Ivory coast: Adidjain, Agboville, Daloa;
- Spain: Albacete, Alcañiz, Barbastro, Bilbao, Granada, Jaca, Logroño, Pamplona, Madrid, Peralta de la Sal, Seville, Soria, Tafalla, Tolosa, Valencia, Vitoria, Zaragoza;
- Philippines: Kiblawan;
- Gabon: Libreville;
- Equatorial Guinea: Bata, Ebebiyin;

To connect one continent's offices of to another continent's, use a thick, pink thread or piece of wool. By doing so, you'll create a network across the hall or corridor, etc. That thread will symbolize the Itaka-Escolapios network and the solidarity between the offices and people, etc.

In each class or group of the Calasanz Movement, the students think about how life was before the COVID-19 pandemic and how things are now.

Students imagine that they have the chance to start from scratch: Restart their life. What would they like to change? (Each grade is given a different field:)

- Kindergarten: Family / coloring facemasks
- First & Second Grade: Family / coloring facemasks
- Third & Fourth Grade: Family
- Fifth & Sixth Grade: School
- Seventh & Eighth Grade: Environment
- Ninth & Tenth Grade: Countries
- Eleventh & Twelfth Grade: Society

Each student writes their proposal for transformation on a small piece of paper.

The groups hang their proposals on the pink thread (with sticky tape, for example).

The group or class can then take a picture next to the map of continents. The news can then be posted on Itaka-Escolapios social media and at schools.

This is a very visual activity and a good reminder of the campaign.
